Remember
you are responsible for
the noise and behaviour of
your guests. If you receive
complaints from neighbours,
take responsibility and
act on the complaint.

When returning home from organised
events please ensure the party
doesn't continue on the street or at
home, when other residents may be
affected.

If you still decide to have a house
party...

- Have the party on a weekend and agree to finish at a reasonable hour
- Let neighbours know about any planned party
- Keep the music down especially the bass and check levels regularly
- DJ decks and loudspeakers are not appropriate
- Keep doors and windows shut when playing music
- If the party starts outside move everyone inside in the evening
- Ask your guests to leave quietly.

Are you affected by noise from your neighbour?



Nottingham City Council's Community Protection Division and Nottinghamshire Police are working in partnership to address issues of anti-social behaviour in our community. We investigate and resolve complaints about unreasonable levels of noise, such as loud music and barking dogs.

If you are affected by noise from neighbouring parties please call Nottinghamshire Police on their non-emergency number 101 while the noise is happening.

Please explain exactly what is happening and what disruption it is causing. Police Officers will aim to attend and, if necessary, warn your neighbour. Please understand that the length of time it takes for officers to attend could be affected by other incidents reported to the Police across the city at that time.

If noise from a particular property is a regular continuing problem the Police will refer the case to the Pollution Control Team in Community Protection for further investigation.
